Petrojam Prices


- 87 Octane price increased by 0.15% (JMD\$0.25) this week to JMD\$162.91. The gas price opened the year 2022 at J\$167.42 and decreased by JMD\$4.51 year to date.
- 90 Octane price increased by 0.15% (JMD\$0.25) this week to JMD\$166.89. The gas price open the year 2022 at JMD\$172.88 and decreased by JMD\$5.99 year to date.
- Diesel price increased by 0.12% (JMD\$0.25) this week to JMD\$208.34. The diesel price open the year 2022 at JMD\$162.42 and increased by JMD\$45.92 year to date.

Brent Oil

Brent oil price increased by 1.69% or US\$1.37 relative to the prior week. Oil traded on December 22, 2022 at US\$82.58 per barrel relative to US\$81.21 on December 15, 2022. Brent oil opened 2022 year at US\$78.98 per barrel and has increased by US\$3.60 (4.56%) year to date.





This Week in Petroleum

U.S. Average Regular Gasoline and Diesel Prices Decreased

On December 19, 2022, the U.S. average regular gasoline retail price decreased by 12 cents to \$3.12 per gallon, \$0.18 lower than a year ago. The East Coast price decreased by 11 cents to \$3.12 per gallon. The Gulf Coast price decreased by 9 cents to \$2.64 per gallon. The West Coast price decreased by 16 cents to \$3.98 per gallon. The Midwest price decreased by 12 cents to \$2.91 per gallon. The Rocky Mountain price decreased by 14 cents to \$3.09 per gallon.

The average diesel fuel price decreased by 16 cents to \$4.60 per gallon on December 19, 2022, \$0.97 higher than a year ago. The Rocky Mountain price decreased by 17 cents to \$4.86 per gallon. The Midwest price decreased by 17 cents to \$4.48 per gallon. The East Coast price decreased by 16 cents to \$4.85 per gallon. The Gulf Coast price decreased by 14 cents to \$4.21 per gallon. The West Coast price decreased by 15 cents to \$5.14 per gallon.



This Week in Petroleum (cont'd)

Inventories for Propane/Propylene Decreased

There was a decrease in U.S. propane/propylene stocks last week by approximately 2.92 million barrels to 87.42 million barrels as of December 16, 2022, approximately 17.39 million barrels more than the average inventory levels a year ago to date.

Additionally, East Coast, Gulf Coast, Midwest and Rocky Mountain/West Coast inventories decreased by 1.16 million barrels, 0.98 million barrels, 0.59 million barrels and 0.20 million barrels, respectively.
